# Bio

My name is Manuel Moncayo (b. 1989, Guadalajara, Mexico). I work professionally as a photographer, alongside ventures into performance, curation, and writing. I live between Berlin and Potsdam in Germany.

From childhood, I have been drawn to documenting my surroundings, beginning with family road trips and holiday excursions captured on a video camera gifted to me by my parents at age ten.

I have kept a diary since age 17. At first, it was simply a record of my days, but since 2013 I have shared it online as a mix of photographs and texts. This has served as the foundation of my creative practice and my professional career.

Over time, my oeuvre has become a record of my life, alongside my ongoing interest in photographing gay men and my connection to nature and light. Adulthood has brought a quiet, deeper awareness of my surroundings, and an appreciation for vast landscapes. Lately, I have been writing longer texts and experimenting with video, further developing my work as a writer and filmmaker.




# Dreams as Reality

2013 - Ongoing

By connecting gay men with nature and making their presence an emotional one, this ongoing series proposes a new narrative of the homosexual experience. Within the limited portrayals in the history of art, the portraits assert openness and presence. In contrast to twentieth-century representations, which often framed homosexuality as countercultural or oversexualized, this approach is naturalist, affirming "we are part of nature."








# Rarities


2023




# **Plant Magic**

2021

Plant Magic was created over two weeks in September 2021 during the Plant Magic Art Residency in San Vicente del Raspeig, Spain.

During the residency, Moncayo followed a microdosing practice with psychedelics while living alongside ten artists in a shared space. The project resulted in a photographic series, a video animation (continuous loop), and a written diary.








# Foreign Atmospheres 2021

Foreign Atmospheres is a photographic series captured between 2016 and 2019, a period marked by constant travel and the absence of a fixed home.

The series records still lifes within regional environments, capturing elements that reflect the identity of each place, including street signs, building details, objects, and scenes specific to a city or civilization.










# Espacios de Transición


Espacios de Transición was presented in the group exhibition Do You See Me Wanting More?, curated by Manuel Moncayo, Spyros Rennt, and the collective RedRubberRoad. The exhibition took place within an abandoned mosque scheduled for conversion into a luxury apartment complex.

The series examines transitional architectural spaces as an analogy for the LGBTQ+ experience and includes seventeen photographs and a video (04:37 min) presented across two screens. The contrast between sharp and blurred imagery reflects the ambiguity of navigating these spaces.

As part of the process, photographer Manuel Moncayo collaborated with choreographer Thierry Smits, capturing still images to analyze the rhythm of the performance and to serve as guidelines for dramaturgy and archival documentation.

Anima Ardens is a contemporary performance that explores the intensity of altered states and their impact on the body. With no set or props, the focus remains entirely on the performers and their responses to shared stimuli.

The photographs have been exhibited at the Schwules Museum Berlin and were included in the benefit auction for the Elton John AIDS Foundation, organized by The Little Black Gallery London as part of the Paris Photo fair in 2019.

Born from the need to create tangible art, rituals takes the form of a limited-edition box containing 22 fine art prints. The box was advertised only with its title and photographs of the exterior, allowing the contents to remain a secret for the collector to discover.

Photographed in rural Europe and in places of worship in Mexico, *rituals* explores the concealment of messages, with the artist engaging in meditation during the act of photographing.



# Guys, Light and Nature 2015

Manuel Moncayo's first published photo book, Guys, Light, and Nature, was released by Editorial Portfolio 1000, a publishing initiative by Bruno Gmünder. The project provided a platform for emerging artists, offering visibility in the early stages of their careers.

Moncayo's work reflects an instinctive approach to photography that seeks to redefine the portrayal of gay men beyond conventional narratives by situating them within the natural world.

The foreword was written by art director Naikee Simoneu, marking the beginning of a long-term creative collaboration between the two.





# Paralleler Garten

Brandenburg, 2023

Co-curated by Manuel Moncayo and Maria Isas, Paralleler Garten took place in the Schlossgarten Petzow in Brandenburg, a nineteenth-century walled garden.

Visual and audio works, along with sculptural and taxidermy pieces were installed across the ferry lawn, the stumpery, the rose garden, and the medicinal garden, introducing new perspectives onto the landscape.

Featuring artists: Camille Soulat, Cécile Wesolowski, Gaia Vincensini, Hristos Hantzis, Hugo Laporte, Joshua Petherick, Manuel Uhthoff, Marián Roma, Mauricio Orozco, Mikos Meininger, Phillip Langer, and Udo Koloska.

Guided by a surrealist sensibility, the exhibition unfolded over two months as the artworks remained outdoors, gradually shifting in relation to the garden and the changing season.

My work is a search for quiet images, for moments that exist beyond the noise of the world.

I was born by the Pacific Ocean, where the horizon is endless and solitude feels like home. My images are about presence. Beauty is not in perfection but in impermanence, in the way the light touches the skin before it disappears.

Photography for me is **dreamlike**, undefined, dissolving at the edges.

I follow the light.
